what is a modern discipline?



disciplinarity, which typifies the attitude of thinking within the box; multidisciplinary, which pursues knowledge in parallel between disciplines; and transdisciplinarity, which seeks to find a greater unity beyond commonality.

interdisciplinarity concerns the transfer of methods from one discipline to another

Neumann: discipline specific academic practices Gonick: Tortorous processes that pass for decision making

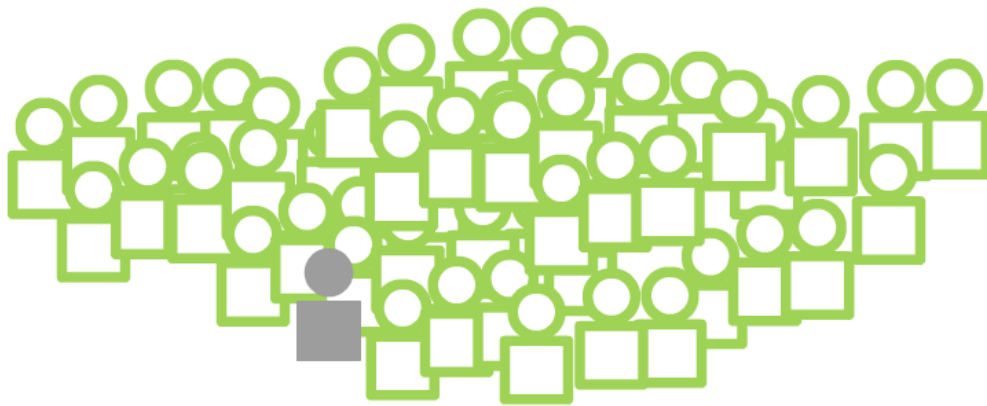

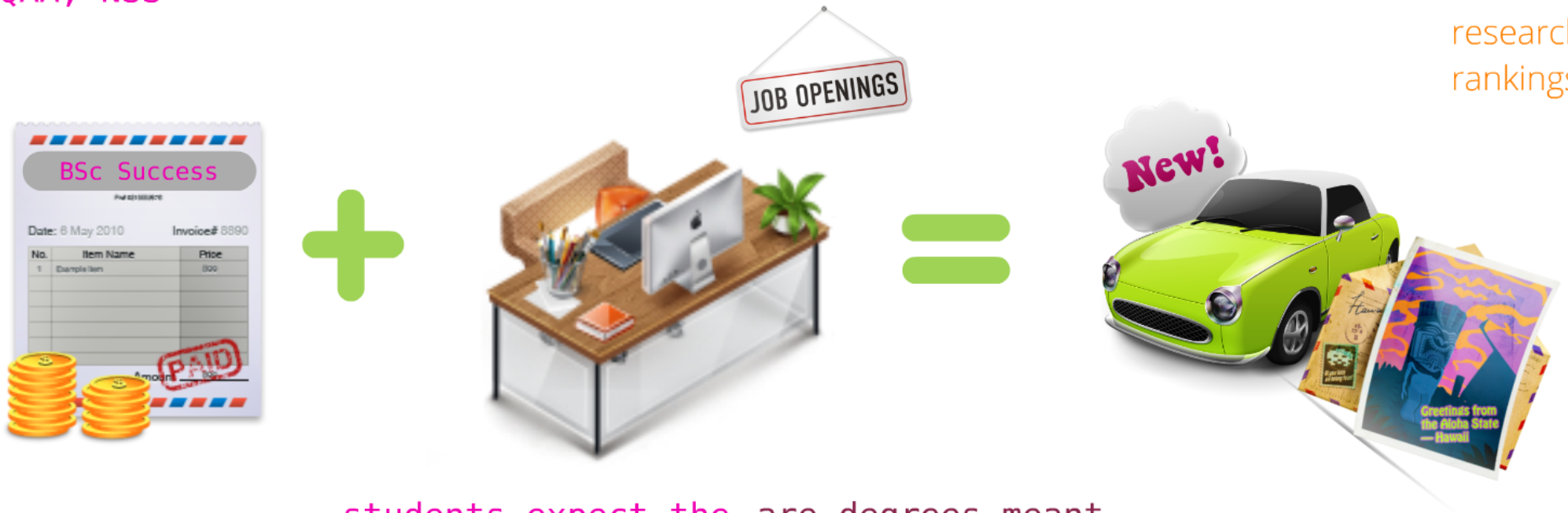

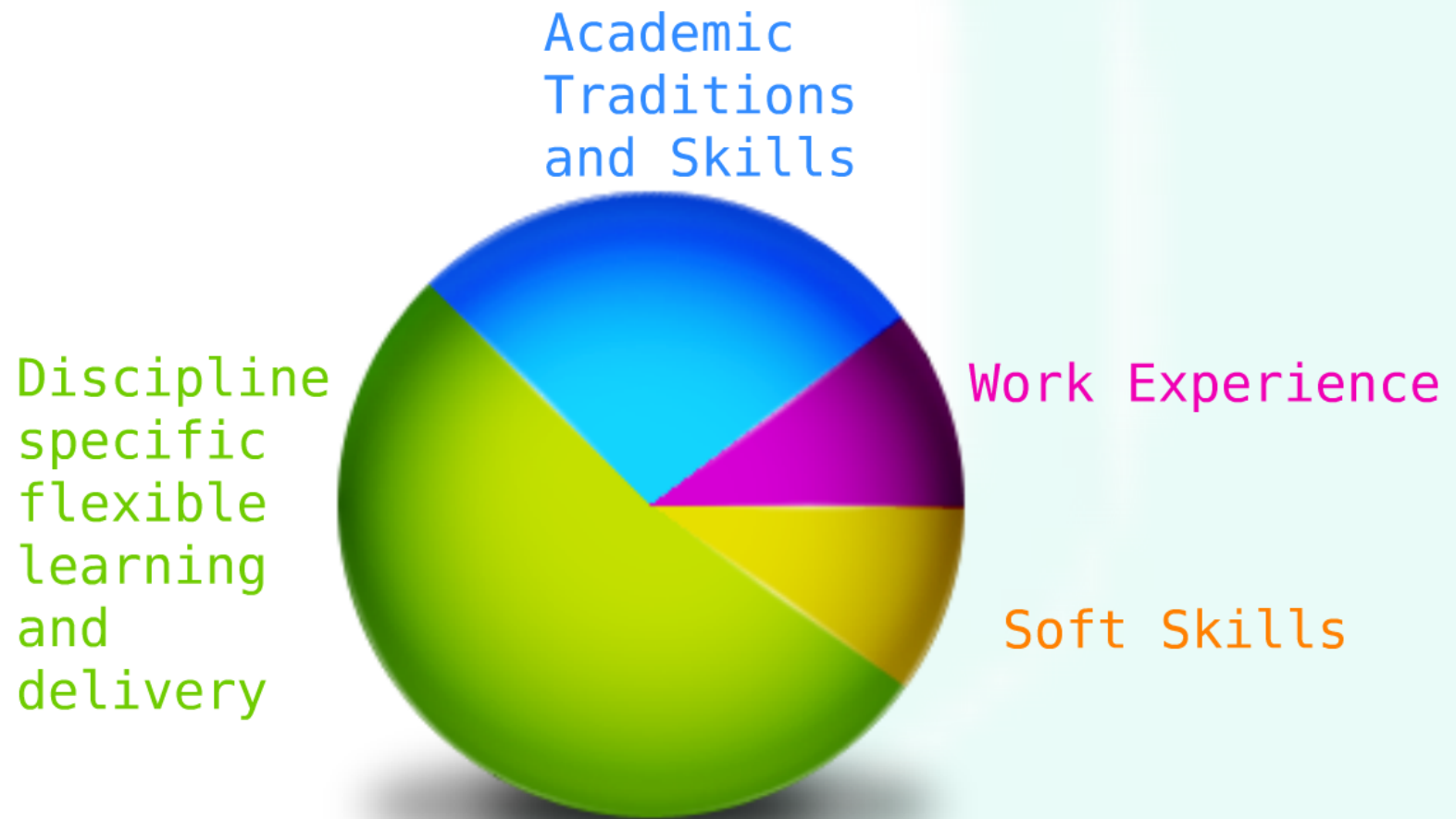
